Courtesy Vessel Safety Check

A certified Vessel Examiner will provide you with a free courtesy vessel safety check of your vessel's compliance with federal and state requirements. Upon satisfactory completion of the vessel safety check, you will be awarded a SAFETY DECAL that will be affixed to your boat. This signifies to USCG Law Enforcement Teams that you have passed a USCG Auxiliary Safety Check.

The vessel safety check is a volunteer program that is not a law enforcement action and no official report is made to any law enforcement authority.
